udrey had been homeless for two years – and was so malnourished that those who knew her didn't recognize her – when she felt God tugging at her heart. "I began to feel uncomfortable in the crack houses, like I didn't belong," she recalls. So she reached out to a relative, and through a chain of events she feels could only have been orchestrated by God, she made a phone call to Bridgeport Rescue Mission.

Now in our faith-based New Life Program, Audrey is embracing opportunities to focus on her relationship with the Lord, on letting go of her past and on the tools she needs to build her future. After just a few months, she is flourishing. "I've learned how to deal with things that used to keep me down, how to set boundaries and how to love myself," she says. Most importantly, "I've

> learned I'm valuable in the Kingdom of God."

# Because of You, Hope is Restored through...

**Food** 

Three meals a day are served in our dining room to Mission residents and guests and struggling community members, while Pantry Bags are provided weekly for impoverished families. And our Mobile Kitchens distribute food to hungry adults and children at scheduled stops in Bridgeport and South Norwalk.



### **Clothing**

Gently used shirts, pants, coats and shoes are given free of charge to those in our care and in our community through our Blessing Rooms and at our Mobile Kitchen stops.

### Shelter

Men, women and children find clean, safe beds in a faith-based environment where their need for food, showers, clothing and other essentials are relieved. They're offered guidance and resources to overcome temporary challenges and opportunities for long-term life transformation.



In our New Life Program, men and women battling substance abuse are empowered to break the chains of addiction. Through spiritual guidance, life-skills training, adult education and supportive housing, they become stable and contributing members of their communities.

### **Supportive Housing for Men and Women**

Graduates of our New Life Program are provided housing, case management and on-site apprenticeship positions to assist them in their transition to independent living.
